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



#### PROTOTYPE AND BACKGROUND INFO:

In 1984, EMD unveiled the first four SD60 demonstrator locomotives. The SD60 was equipped with a 3,800 horsepower, 16 cylinder, turbocharged 710G3A prime mover. Five years later, EMD began offering the SD60 with the wide nose "safety" cab with the infamous "Tri-Clops" 3-piece windshield, thus creating the SD60M. The term "Tri-clops" is a popular railfan nickname that refers to the original 3-window cab design.

Union Pacific was the first road to order these new SD60M locomotives followed by Burlington Northern and SOO Line. BN's SD60M locomotives went on to the merged BNSF while the SOO Line units went to Canadian Pacific. Some of the BNSF units found more mileage with Norfolk Southern and in lease service for CEFX.

CPKC 4412 is one of the first units that has been repainted into the new Canadian Pacific Kansas City Limited paint scheme. It was built by EMD in October 1976 for Soo Line and retained its original number when it became part of the CP Rail system.

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








In the summer of 1972 Penn Central began assembling its fleet of 223 GP38-2's with the delivery of #'s 7940-8039. This fleet of units was used system-wide in virtually every type of freight service and would go on to serve as an important part of Conrail's locomotive fleet.

#### PROTOTYPE SPECIFIC INFORMATION

By the early 1970s, many first generation diesels were reaching the end of their service lives. The most common replacement locomotive became the GP38-2. EMD began production of the 16-cylinder, non-turbocharged, 2000 horsepower engine in 1972. Unlike the GP38's engine, which drove a generator to supply power to the traction motors, the GP38-2s prime mover drove an alternator which produced AC electrical current that was rectified to DC to power the four traction motors. Another major change for the GP38-2 was the introduction of the "dash 2" modular electrical cabinet. For more than 40 years, the GP38-2 has worked main line freights, locals, switching jobs, yard service, helpers, snow fighting trains, and hump power. Many remain in service today.

# **All Road Names**

#### PROTOTYPE HISTORY:

In the late 1970s, the dire condition of many railroads' gondola fleet was becoming apparent. Freight cars from the '40s and '50s were failing under the heavier loads and rough handling the gondolas typically endured. The TTX corporation stepped in to produce a system-wide pooled gondola service, ordering a fleet of 4000 new gondolas to be produces by five manufacturers. While the Athearn model is based on the Thrall-built version, all five are visually similar except for small details that require a trained eye to spot. Designers had identified the weaknesses of earlier gondola design, adding reinforced top cords with bolted corners, additional plate steel reinforcement to the ends, and bolting the exterior posts to the floor instead of welding; all features that allowed the gondolas to sustain rougher handling...and they needed it. The new paint smell didn't last long. While other freight cars that looked the way these gondolas did would be retired, the engineers had done a commendable job at keeping these cars safe to operate even in a deformed condition. At over 40 years old, these cars are still circulating on railroads today, beaten, patched, dirtied, but not forgotten.





#### PROTOTYPE HISTORY:

The T-28 Trojan was developed by North America Aviation as a replacement training aircraft for the T-6 Texan. The XT-28 (NA-159 Company designation) was first flown on September 24th, 1949. The aircraft was quickly adopted as a primary trainer by the United States Air Force with the United States Navy and Marine Corps following soon after. While only operational with the USAF until the early 1960s, the U.S. Navy, Marine Corps and U.S. Coast Guard used the aircraft well into the early 1980s. The T-28 would have a storied career with other agencies such as the CIA as well as foreign countries and would be used as a primary flight trainer to ground attack and research craft. The last active duty T-28 was retired from official service in 1994. Many retired T-28s were sold to private civil operators and can be seen today flying as warbirds at air shows, while others are on display at aircraft and military museums through out the world.

The Atheam model most closely represents the T-28B model which features an improved 9-cylinder, 1,425 horsepower engine with a 10'1" three-bladed propeller and belly-mounted air-brake.

It was the mid -1970s, and the incentive per diem box car boom was just beginning. New, brightly painted box cars seemed to appear overnight. Many were lettered for various short lines. FMC (Food Machinery Corporation) was a significant builder of many of these cars. The 50' outside post, non-terminating end box car, became the foundation for new per diem cars built in the 1970s. The 50' FMC cars also varied in door configuration and style to better suit each customer. These models can still be seen today in the modern railroading scene.

#### PROTOTYPE HISTORY:

With the advent of rotary dumpers, the bathtub gondola allowed the railroads to haul more bulk cargo per carload than conventional open top hoppers. The absence of unloading gates and other appliances that affect internal capacity allowed for additional capacity per car. This improved transportation efficiency for these assigned service cars. The term "Bathtub" gondola is due to the internal shape of the car.

As these steel cars were replaced with lighter aluminum gondolas that could carry yet heavier loads, they entered their second life. While a great number continued to haul coal for other railroads that didn't require the newest fleet of coal haulers, the low cost of the used freight cars made them an attractive for other uses. Some were retained for MOW fleets. Others found their way to trash and scrap service. Function over aesthetics rule this industry and these cars received extensions adding half again to the cars volume and reinforcements to hold the car together when haphazardly loaded to haul lighter, but bulkier loads.
